



Summary of Urban Biodiversity Context


- There is no green city plan however, there are natural and planted trees and green corridors in urban areas.



Challenges in implementing urban biodiversity strategy

- Biodiversity data on the municipal level is not readily available.
- There is inadequate manpower for biodiversity data enlistment and management.
- There are inadequate multi-sectorial actors and ministries to address urban challenges



Opportunities for implementing urban biodiversity strategy

By implementing an urban biodiversity strategy, Liberian cities can:

- Develop the capacity of key personnel in biodiversity data collection and management.
- Begin inter-sectorial coordination on urban biodiversity.
- Develop tools and processes to monitor and evaluate ongoing changes in biodiversity.
- Create awareness among the citizenry on the environment and the importance of biodiversity.
- Better manage waste.
