

Urban Development Plan (StEP) Climate 2.0 - planning approaches to climate change

Berlin Energy and Climate Programme – supporting e.g. climate-nature projects

Challenges

- Securing urban green and blue space before development
- Integrating nature and biodiversity into legally binding instruments (e.g. building code) and urban land use planning
- Professional capacities and secure funding with regard to nature/biodiversity planning, implementation and maintenance
- Adequate participation of citizens and consideration of their needs in planning
- Cooperation between different actors across sectors and governance levels
- Mobilise the civil society (citizens, private companies, housing companies, science etc.) to promote nature

Types of support needed: legally binding instruments, capacity building, governance approaches for cooperation, exchange of good practice, financial resources

**BERLIN URBAN
NATURE PACT**

„We will implement targeted and visible actions, projects, and processes until 2030, which aim to achieve the set targets or at least ensure that the conditions and measures to achieve them are established.“

- Selection of at least 15 out of a total of 28 targets (at least 1 target from each target area)
- Mayor needs to sign the pact
- Action-orientated action plan (within one year)
- Exchange and coordination within the city administration

Target areas

1. Education and nature experience
2. Species and Habitats
3. Co-habitation
4. Green infrastructure and ecosystems
5. Blue infrastructure and water management
6. Soil health
7. Food and agriculture

Implementation Principles

- Commitment, action and ambition
- Policy, governance, financing & funding frameworks
- Exchange and joint learning
- Co-creation
- Capacity building
- Environmental justice
- Reporting and monitoring
