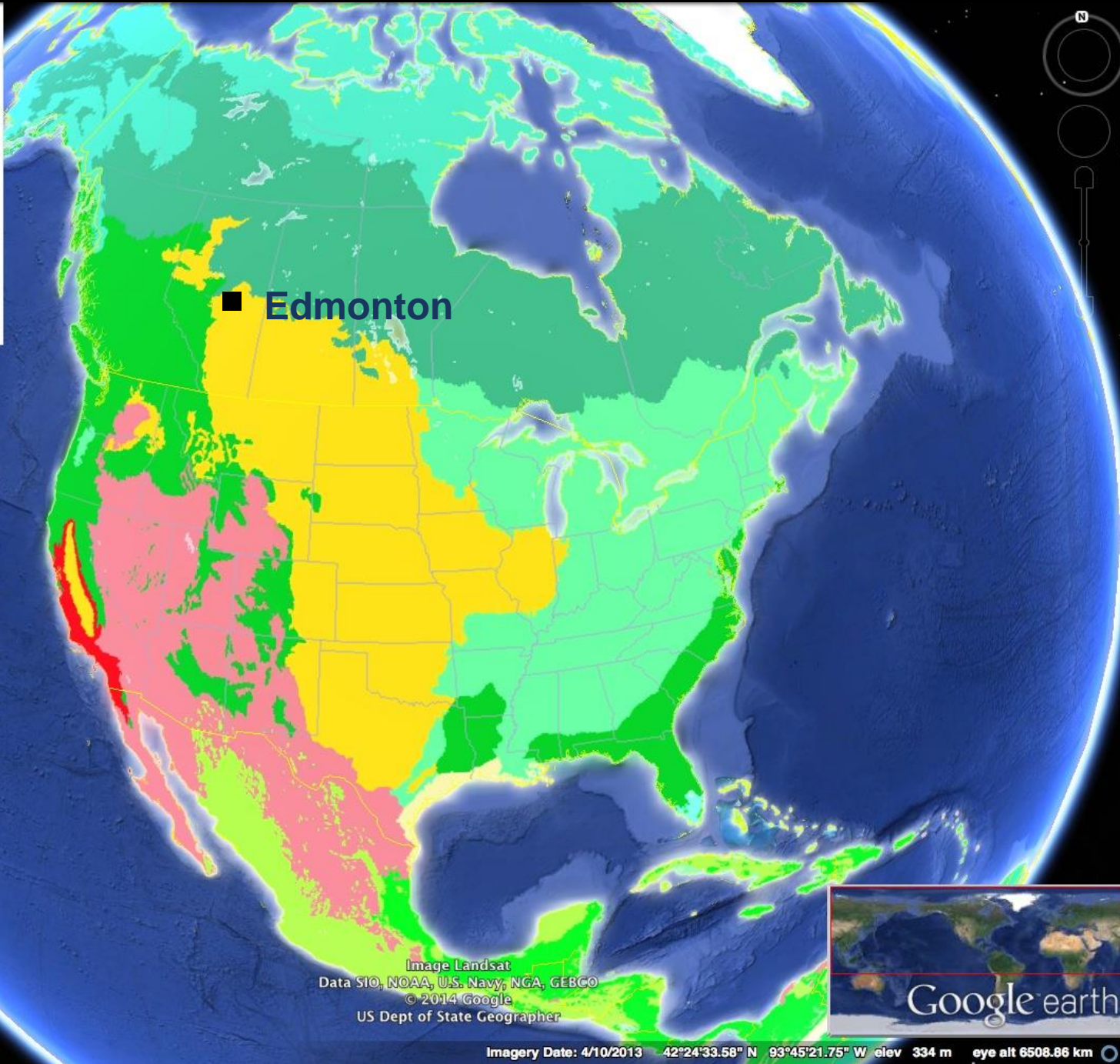

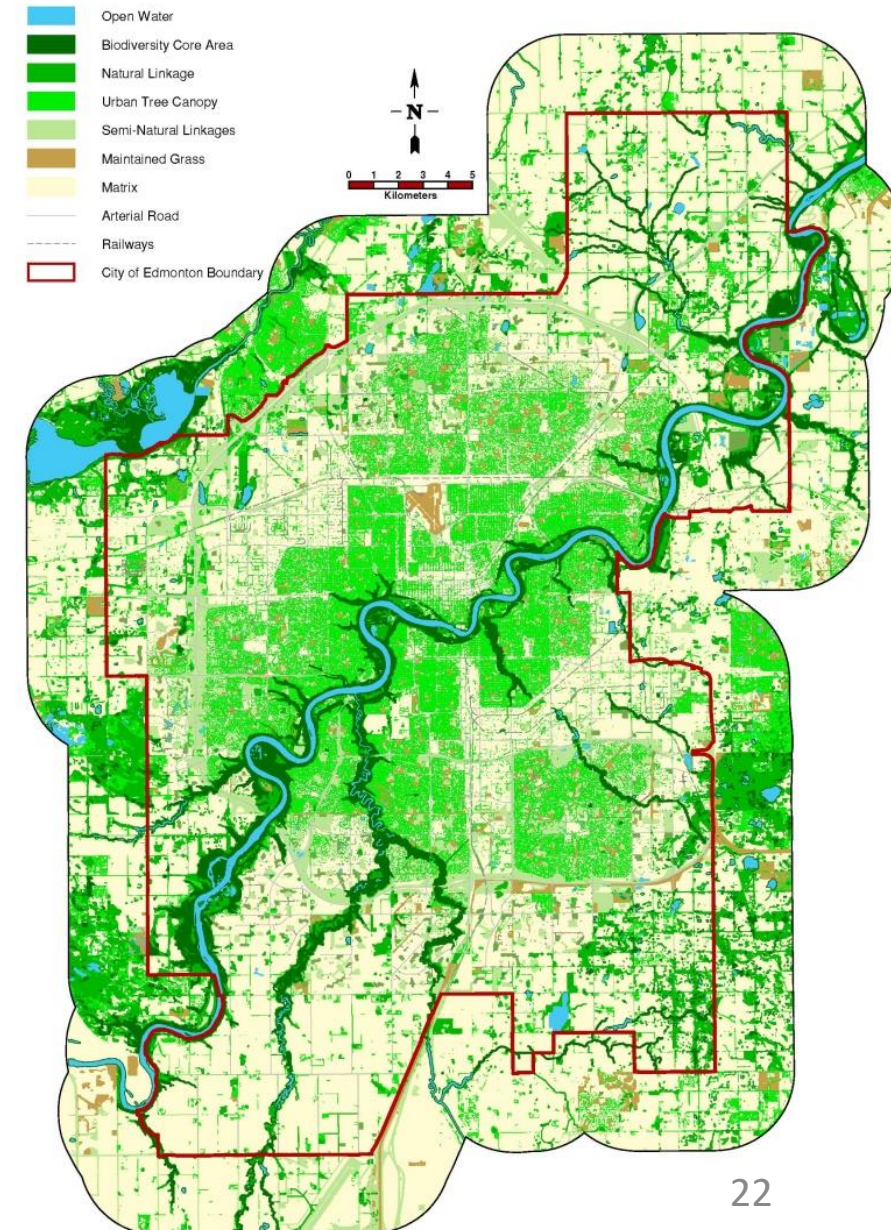
Biomes modified from Olson et al. (2001)

The Secretariat supports national governments, Regions and cities to adopt green urbanization and city operation standards:

- **Publication support: “Perspectives for cities and nature - Cities Biodiversity Outlook”, “Nature in the Urban Century Assessment”**
- **Support to regional/subregional proposal development and projects, technical exchanges, engagement with CBD processes**

Examples of policy and technical support:

- (i) ICLEI guidelines for vertical cooperation on national biodiversity strategies and action plans**
- (ii) UN Habitat/FAO Guiding Principles for Urban-Rural Linkages (green teleconnections for water and food security, disaster risk reduction)**
- (iii) Technical indicators such as the Singapore Index on Cities Biodiversity;**
- (iv) Best practice platforms/cities' registries such as CitiesWithNature, Regions for Biodiversity Learning Platform.**



Ambition: At least 50 cities take advantage of green SCIP elements and incorporate nature into a commitment to the CBD's 2020 Sharm to Kunming Action Agenda for Nature and People
